

ENGLISH 9

ENGLISH 9 LITERATURE (FICTION)

Short Story Study: Teacher selected short stories

- Examples: "Pancakes" (Bauer), "Sound of Thunder" (Bradbury),
 "Marigold"s (Collier)
- Short story writing/project

Elements of Drama: Trifles (Glaspell)

Novel Study: To Kill a Mockingbird (Lee)

Elements of Poetry: Teacher selected poems

- Examples: "My Papa's Waltz," "The Road Not Taken,"
 "Theme for English B"
- Poetry writing project

- Annotating text
- Writing: Responses to Literature
- Grammar skills (new and previous content)

ENGLISH 9H LITERATURE

Blended genre studies that pair fiction with nonfiction in all units of study.

Drama Study: Twelfth Night (Shakespeare)

Prose Study: To Kill a Mockingbird (Lee)

 Poetry, nonfiction and other media are blended in to provide alternate perspectives.


